In connection with the preparation of the application, the applicant must provide all required information which might be of importance for the decision according to the Immigration Act section 83.

- **If the application is submitted for processing without satisfactory documentation, it may be rejected on this ground.**
- Please note that you may be required to supply additional documentation to that stated below.

All documents must be supplied in their **original form** or **as a copy certified by a public authority** or other body with such competence. The documents must be translated into English or Norwegian by an approved translator.

The application fee is to be paid in cash in Israeli shekel:

Family reunification: NIS 2420, Children under 18 free of charge.

- The fee is paid for the processing of your application, not for the visa or the permit.
The fee is therefore not refunded if the decision is negative

Applications from parent over 60 years with child in Norway must additionally contain:

Documentation of residence permit for children living in other countries than the applicant's home country
